All families with students in our Catholic Schools will soon receive a packet of information on the Application/Re-Application Process for the 2011-2012 school year. Application and Course Selection (previously termed Registration) for Seton Catholic Central High School will be held on Thursday, March 3rd from 3:30-7:30pm in our school Gym. We have found this single date of Application/Re-Application and Course Selection to be relatively successful as we need enrollment numbers and student course requests to determine the vital issues of staffing and programs. **PLEASE MAKE THIS DATE A PRIORITY** as we continue to keep SCCHS a strong and vibrant school of faith, choice and academic excellence.

Seton Catholic Central High School has F.A.C.T.S. forms available for those applying for scholarships and financial aid. These forms must be completed by March 25th. I strongly encourage anyone with financial concerns to complete this form and send it to the address indicated. I have encouraged our families to consider Catholic Schools as an investment. We do not hesitate to file forms for FAFSA for college and we should think of our Catholic Schools commitment in much the same way. Application forms for our in-house Scholarship program at SCCHS will also be available soon.

As the holy season of Lent begins in March, Seton Catholic Central High School will again hold a Mardi Gras Jazz Mass in the Gymnasium on Tuesday, March 8th. We are inviting ALL students and families in our Catholic Schools to help us to celebrate as the "Saints go marching in" with spirit, prayer and preparation. Please join us here at 5:30pm for Mass followed by a Pancake Supper sponsored by our Senior Class.

The 2011 Junior Prom—"Winter Night in Central Park" will be held at Traditions at the Glen on Saturday, February 12th. Mrs. Kristen Kinner is our Junior Class Moderator and is working diligently with the Junior Class Officers to make this a special event for our students. Further details about the Junior Prom are included in this newsletter. Mass will be provided for our students and chaperones before the dinner/dance. Please review the rules for this event with your son/daughter and let us WORK

TOGETHER to support good choices for our students—no careless plans, alcohol, etc... We wish to join you in providing a memory of happiness and pride NOT one of regret and injury. Please let us support each other at Seton Catholic Central High School as we work in partnership for our young people!

Architects have been asked to present a description of the proposed renovation for the Boys' and Girls' Restrooms. This proposal will be sent out for bids from local contractors and we expect to receive these bids by mid-February. We want to begin construction as soon as possible. When the renovations are completed (probably will take 3 months), we will invite you to come and review these changes.

We are in the process of selecting the faculty who will staff the new Grade 7 & 8 sections here at Seton Catholic Central. Our plan is to announce them by March 1st to help parents make their Application choices for September 2011. This is an ambitious target but we are pursuing it. The tuition for Grades 7 & 8 will remain at the current level of \$4,200.00 for affiliated and \$4,700.00 for non-affiliated students.

The academic year has a momentum of its own and I find myself caught up in its flow. There is certainly never a dull moment. I continue to find myself energized and encouraged as I watch God's grace reflected back to me by all of you. Please introduce yourself to me whenever we meet.

College Financial Aid Assistance: The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) college financial aid form is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The online application will be processed much more quickly than the paper copy and is recommended. The CSS “Profile” application that some schools require is available in the Guidance Office. The FAFSA is the most commonly used financial aid form for colleges. Remember to list a New York State school in “Step Six” of the FAFSA if your child is applying to a NYS school to assure consideration for a New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) Award. Those of you who filed for the FAFSA for a student already in college will receive a renewal FAFSA in the mail.

A Statewide “SUNY Financial Aid Day” will be held at Broome Community College, on Saturday, February 12, 2011. Register online at www.suny.edu/studentevents or call 1-800-342-3811.

To get the most out of Financial Aid Day, please bring the following information with you:

- Pin numbers, one for student and one for parent (www.pin.ed.gov). Request this prior to attending the session.
- Student’s and parent’s 2010 Federal income tax return or estimated return
- Student’s and parent’s Social Security numbers
- Drivers licenses—parent & student
- W-2s and earned income for 2010—parents & student
- Bank statements & investment information for 2010—parents & student
- Other 2010 business records—investments, stocks, etc.
- Alien registration card for non-U.S. citizens
- 2010 untaxed income information

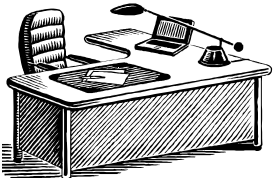

## Application School Year 2011-2012

This year, Application/Re-Application and Course Selection for the SCCHS 2011-2012 school year will take place on **Thursday, March 3rd** from 3:30pm-7:30pm in the SCCHS Gym. (The snow date is Thursday, March 10<sup>th</sup> from 3:30pm-7:30pm in the Gym.) (Other schools in the system may be holding their Application/Re-Application days/nights on other dates.)

Re-Application materials will be mailed by the Catholic Schools Office to families with children already attending any of the Catholic Schools of Broome County. You will need to bring all these materials with you on March 3rd in order to complete the Re-Application process. For all families who are current with tuition payments, re-application fees have been lowered. The application fee for one child is \$50. For families with more than one child, who are current with their tuition payments, the re-application fee will be capped at \$100. As in previous years, the Re-Application Fee is applied to your tuition account, however, you must re-apply by March 15, 2011 to receive the reduced fee.

In addition, students will be completing the Course Selection process. This process begins prior to March 3rd with our Guidance Counselors and Teachers meeting with the students. Course Selection worksheets and materials are distributed to the students so that they may discuss options with their parents. On March 3rd SCCHS Guidance Counselors and Teachers will be in attendance in the Gym throughout the evening to answer your questions concerning the course selections and/or options that are available for your child.

For parents of incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade students, the Guidance Counselors will be meeting with the Catholic Middle School principals and teachers. The purpose of these meetings is to learn as much about the academic achievement and needs of the current 8<sup>th</sup> grade students as possible. In addition, we have the results from the Placement Exam and will be receiving all the records from the NYS Testing Program as well as the students' permanent records containing all the report card grades/comments. All these sources of information, together with teacher and principal comments and parent input, will help to ensure appropriate course placement of our incoming freshmen. So mark the date and time on your calendars now:

### **Application/Re-Application Thursday, March 3rd 3:30pm-7:30pm SCCHS Gym**

We strongly encourage all families to make every effort to attend Re-Application Night on March 3rd. Our budgeting and staffing plans are entirely based on enrollment and student course requests. If you have questions or concerns, please call Dr. Schulz, Mrs. Coppola, or Mrs. D'Alessandro at 723-5307.

Finally, help us spread the good news of Broome County Catholic Schools! Recommend a new family who applies and attends one of our schools for the 2011-2012 school year and earn a \$500 Friend Finder's Fee. **FACTS application packets will be mailed during first week of February.** If for some reason you do not receive a FACTS application packet, please call Mrs. De Angelo at 723-5307.



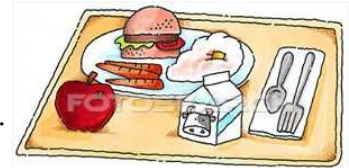
## “Soles for Souls”

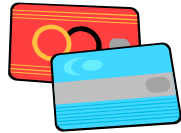

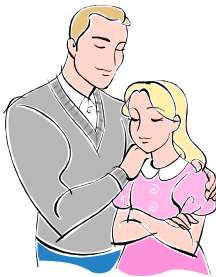

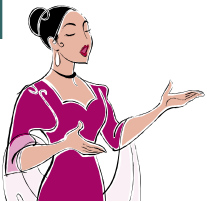
